

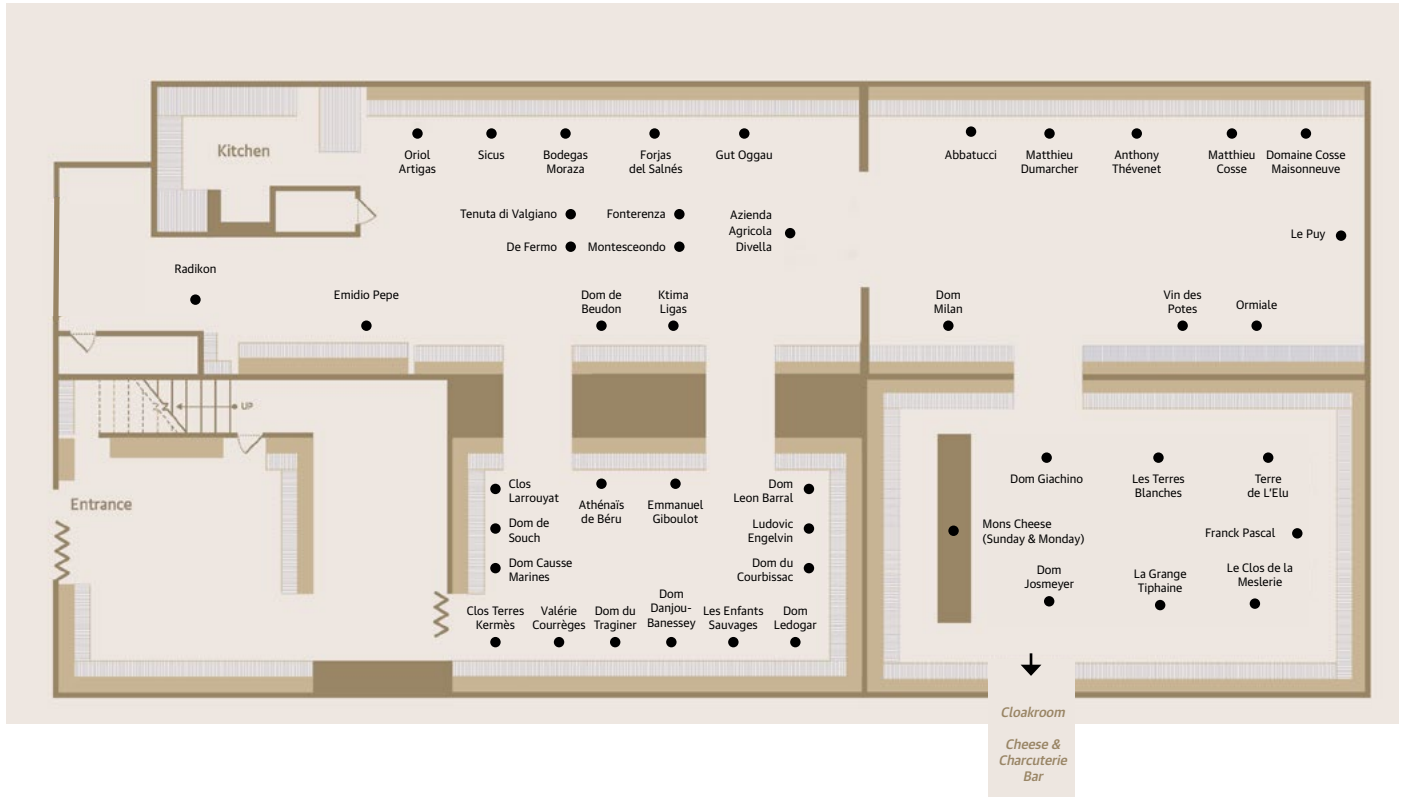

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The project began when Yvonne and her husband, René, bought 16 hectares of land at the top of a hill in the village of Laroin, southwest France. They rebuilt the pile of rubble at the top of the hill into a manse and lived happily there for several years with their family until René sadly passed away. They had always talked about starting their own vineyard there but had never quite got round to it. So, in memory

of her late husband, Yvonne Hegoburu started planting vines.

The first wine Hegoburu produced was so good that it won an award in Paris in 1990. It was not long before she discovered the concept of biodynamic winemaking and she became part of a small community of biodynamic winemakers. As of 1994, her land has been certified as biodynamic.

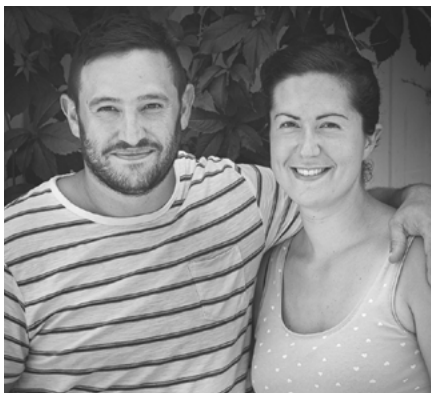

Maxime and Lucie Salharang began planting Gros Manseng, Petit Manseng, and the native Camaralet at Clos Larrouyat in 2011. The domaine sits on a rare band of Triassic limestone that runs through part of the appellation, marking its wines with a distinctive saline signature.

Clos Larrouyat is known for its powerful fine wines, which are made using biodynamic principles with the utmost respect for both grape and soil.

The domaine produces two Jurançon sec bottlings and one *moelleux*. "Météore" captures the citrusy zip of Petit Manseng (40%) & Gros Manseng (60%) with total charm; "Comète" emphasises the nerve, concentration, and exotic perfume of Petit Manseng; and "Phoenix" is all about the ravishing finesse of late-harvested fruit dried on the vine.

The name Domaine Causse Marines is derived from the domain's geography: Causse after the rocky plateau of limestone and calcareous soil on which the vines grow, and Marines, the name of the river that flows by the estate. Patrice Lescarret started the winery in 1993; he took over from a retiring farmer who grew crops and sold all his grapes to the local Coop.

Patrice Lescarret studied oenology in Bordeaux and jokes that after learning the wrong way around in the school and being paid for a few years to apply this conventional winemaking in other wineries, he now tries to vinify the right way. Patrice does all the work himself.

In 2019 Valérie Courrèges had the opportunity to buy a wine estate with extreme potential in her homeland of Cahors. As a young winemaker Valérie always knew the great potential of the Cahors terroir, and this plot with its high quality old vines and first-rate clay and limestone soil provided her with the canvas she needed to create some very special

wines. "I make wines to enjoy - it's about conviviality and simplicity. You don't need to be a wine connoisseur - the main thing is to take pleasure and enjoy!" Valérie Courrèges.

Matthieu Cosse and Catherine Maisonneuve created Domaine Cosse Maisonneuve in 1999. Both winemakers and oenologists, they took over a 5-hectare estate in Prayssac, near Cahors, and planted it with 40-year-old Malbec (or "cot") vines. Using biodynamic principles, they set out to make wines that genuinely reflected their place of origin. Their first vintage was Les Laquet, grown in a soil of red clay and Jurassic limestone, cultivated

using biodynamic principles, harvested by hand and crushed by foot. They were aged in barrels for 12 to 22 months before being bottled without filtration. The estate is made up of 15 hectares of vineyards; Malbec is planted alongside other grape varieties, such as Cabernet Franc, Merlot and Gamay. The domain has a wide range of plots with different soils - clay, limestone and calcareous gravel. Some plots even overhang the River Lot.

These wines are the result of an exciting Bordeaux project by Matthieu Cosse of Domaine Cosse Maisonneuve. Matthieu's wines are made in collaboration with an old friend of his, Jérôme Ossard, who has been working in Bordeaux for over 24 years with winegrowers who want to really make the most of their best plots of vines. These

particular cuvées come from plot selections of vines with a very high potential thanks to the quality of the terroir from which they grow, resulting in exceptional grapes that in turn, produce high quality yet affordable wine.

Founded in 2007 by owner Fabrice Domercq and Jasper Morrison, Ormiale is situated in the north of the Entre-Deux-Mers region of Bordeaux. Ormiale is vinified and bottled on the property as an appellation Bordeaux contrôlée - Grand Vin de Bordeaux. While the Merlotinox is 100% Merlot, is a stunning Vin de France wine. Everything is done by hand, even de-stemming the grapes! These delicately

handled grapes are vinified in French oak vats and also in stainless steel vats for about 4 to 5 weeks. Yields are typically, around 20-25 hectolitres/hectare. In comparison, the maximum authorised yield for Bordeaux Supérieur in 2009 was 59 hl./ha! If you think you know your Bordeaux wines Ormiale may prove you wrong!

Steeped in history, Le Puy was first built in the early 17th century. Despite the march of time, production here harks back to an older era. Unlike most Bordeaux wines, which are blended from several grapes, this estate crushes grape varieties together allowing the indigenous yeasts from different parcels and grapes to combine. This provides an extra layer of complexity during their

natural fermentation process. These wines are capable of maturing for decades.

From 1990, Le Puy started to move towards sulphite-free vinification, with an extra focus on using only carefully selected grapes without added sulphites, sugars or yeasts, and then allowing the wine to barrel mature for 24 months, with regular stirring in accordance with the lunar calendar.

An agronomist by trade, Thomas, spent his formative years working in Champagne, Burgundy, Provence and California before settling down in the schist-rich lands of Anjou Noir with his partner Charlotte in 2008. Together they started Terre De l'Élu (formerly known as Clos de l'Élu), which tends to eight different grape varieties, covering 20 hectares of organically farmed land in the heart of the Loire.

In 2018, the duo decided to relinquish the word "Clos" which is reserved only for appellation wines. Due to the restrictions imposed under the appellation rules, Charlotte and Thomas say "we prefer to give priority to our freedom and creativity rather than trying to make wines that do not resemble us."

Located south of Angers, Les Terres Blanches has a unique and exceptional terroir made of clay and granite soils with limestone and slate origins. The estate consists of a collection of small plots in a landscape naturally protected by trees, groves, meadows and bird sanctuaries.

Following the rhythm of nature in the vineyard and in the cellar, they manage to achieve wines with great depth and precision. They use Chenin Blanc and a tiny plot of Chardonnay which produce the most incredibly pure and oxidative wine as well as Cabernet Franc and Gamay de Bouze.

organic, sustainable, high-quality winery. He has succeeded on every level, which is apparent in each years' stellar release.

For this fully organic estate, run by Coralie and Damien Delecheneau since 2002, the keyword is 'respect': respect for the soil, for nature, for historical techniques and a demanding fruit. Their philosophy is that this level of respect and care allows the grapes to truly express themselves, with character and elegance.

Domaine de la Grange Tiphaine has ten hectares of vines across two terroirs: Montlouis-sur-Loire and Touraine-Amboise. It was created at the end of the 19th century by Alfonse Delecheneau and has stayed in family hands ever since. "To taste these wines is to truly taste nature."

Franck is famous for his natural approach to winemaking. He began to transform the estate's methodology in 1998, and by 2007 he was officially certified as an organic producer. In fact, he goes much further than many others in attempting to create the perfect wine, bringing in not just natural, organic and biodynamic principles but also naturopathic ideas more commonly associated with acupuncture. This involves considering the energy levels in

living things, from the vine to the soil itself. Treating the vines in this way, he believes, gives them the ability to reach their full potential. He even convinced his compost producer to create a new form of fertiliser, based on lab analysis of his own soil. It contains volcanic sulphur, which allows the liberation of elements that are usually trapped in the limestone. This is one way of recovering the microorganisms often lost after years of conventional farming.

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In 1988, Frédéric took over the 1.5 hectares of vines that his grandfather, Marius Genton, had maintained. The vineyards have been gradually enriched by new grape varieties, drawing on the wealth

of existing Savoyard varieties.

Frédéric Giachino has been producing wine in his domain for more than 20 years, utilising organic techniques for half of that time.

Cushioned between the rolling vineyards of Wintzenheim in Alsace, Domaine Josmeyer has been making wines for five generations dating back to 1854. The 25-hectare estate is spread across 90 plots, with parcels in the famous Grand Cru sites of Hengst and Brand - recognised for their exceptional wine production for centuries. Today sisters Céline and Isabelle

run the Domaine and have been practising biodynamics since 2000. The hand-picked grapes are crushed slowly and left to rest in century-old wooden casks where the wines ferment naturally at their own rhythm. The wines are kept on their lees for several months during winter until they're ready to be bottled and served on your table!

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The Béru family have owned the estate for 400 years, and even writings by 9th-century monks note the vineyards growing here. It was during the Middle Ages that the wines here received international appreciation, often appearing on royal tables.

Despite its long history, current owners Laurence de Béru and her daughter, Athénaïs, were aware that the soil was

fragile. Since 2005, only organic methods have been used on the estate, and from 2010 they began to convert to biodynamic practices. Now only a limited amount of natural chemical intervention is used, such as treatment with sulphur, and a horse-drawn plough prepares the soil. It's no wonder the estate continues to build on its already steadfast reputation.

Athénaïs de Béru is not just the person behind Château de Béru; she also produces her own highly-sought-after wines from grapes that she buys from local vineyards in the department of Yonne.

The négoce has developed a partnership with neighbouring farmers whose grapes are cultivated organically or biodynamically. Athénaïs always remains faithful in creating an authentic expression of the grapes terroir without additives, whilst enjoying a great

Part of Giboulot's love of his organic methods perhaps comes from the fact that he has never done it any differently. He learnt his craft from his father, who ran the estate on an organic basis since 1975 and took over production in 1985 with just a single hectare of land. It was certified biodynamic in 1996. His vines grow in soils of clay and chalk, at 280 to 400 metres elevation. Only indigenous yeast is used in production, which is based firmly on the schedule of the lunar month. He does not

stir the lees and prefers the wine to reach its own level of quality with minimum intervention. He even uses a mechanical screw press rather than a pneumatic equivalent.

As a result of this care and attention to wines and principles, Giboulot's wines are balanced, precise and elegant.

As a young winemaker, Anthony Thévenet worked for with two of the founding fathers of organic viticulture in Beaujolais – Georges Descombes and Jean Foillard. In 2013 he inherited around two hectares of vines from his grandfather and immediately began conversion to organic agriculture. His inaugural vintage attracted

immediate attention, and his 2016 release solidified his position as a master of Gamay and clearly one to watch.

Trained as an oenologist, Matthieu was taught in the conventional way, making wines that he didn't like. Unlearning these practices and eschewing the chemical paraphernalia, he started his estate in a remote area near La Baume de Transit in 2006. His intention was to make wines true

to the grapes he grows. He owns 5 hectares of old vines and produces fresh fruity wines that reflect both the rich terroir and the personality of the maker.

Domaine Milan was created in 1956 by Robert Milan, Henri's father. It was here that Henri planted his first vine at the age of eight. Back then, the land was used for conventional farming methods. This was one of the big changes that were heralded

when Henri took over in 1984. The land had been spoiled by excessive synthetic chemical treatments during the 1970s and early 1980s, so it was at this point the younger Milan moved towards organic production.

If it wasn't for Antoine Abbattucci, most of the grapes now grown by Jean-Charles, Antoine's son, may not exist. In the 1960s, local Corsican grapes were being rapidly replaced by international competitors. Antoine was charged with preserving these varieties and, using a hectare of land, created an ampelographic station and saved the fate of 18 of them. When Jean-Charles took over in 2000 he converted the estate to biodynamics. He then began to graft

some of these old varieties onto their existing vines. Today, 14 of those varieties can be found at Domaine Abbattucci, situated in the Taravo Valley, just south of Ajaccio, the capital of Corsica. The estate produces around 1,500 bottles of each type of wine, so you'll have to hurry if you want to experience the unique qualities of grapes that of grapes that were virtually raised from the dead.

A trained sommelier and former pupil of Didier Dagueneau, Ludovic went back to his native Languedoc and opened a wine shop. He also bought 1 hectare of old Grenache Noir planted in 1955 and started making a bit of wine on the side.

This domain was founded on a biodynamic basis by German film producer Reinhard Brundig in 2002. Brundig was first attracted to the domain due to the complexity of the soil, its established and carefully nurtured vines, and the geographic location, near to Montagne Noire. Now the operation is led by Brunnhilde Claux, whose first vintage was in 2014.

Brunnhilde hand-harvests each variety

and plot of land separately. The grapes are hand-selected, and while the young ones are de-stemmed, the older varieties are often used whole. These grape clusters are then layered and pressed by foot to squeeze out trapped oxygen, before their 9 to 12 days of maceration. Claux's main drive has been to work the vineyards in order to achieve ripeness at the lowest possible Baume – her aim being to capture as much freshness as possible.

Xavier and Matthieu, the current generation of winemakers at the family estate, decided to stop selling their grapes to the local coop in 1998. Then ensued a complete reworking of the farming practices on their 22 hectares of vines. They farm old vines of Carignan and Grenache between the ages of 60 and 120 years old, as well as a

little bit of the rare Carignan Blanc. They are very generous with their experience, always advising other winemakers in the area and trying to bring the reputation of the young Corbières-Boutenac appellation ever higher.

Her grapes are always hand-harvested and treated gently. Zero sulfur /

zero dosage, Alessandra's wines are 100% méthode champenoise. So concentrated into their provenance of clay and limestone that your mouth will salivate for minutes (if not hours) afterwards. Alessandra has already achieved pioneer status within the region as one of the first estates to farm organically and the first to be female-led. The quality of her wine is truly outstanding.

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After several years working in New York City, Silvio Messina took over the Montesecondo estate from his father in 1999. Silvio's first vintage was in 2000, and the conversion to organic was certified in 2004. Montesecondo wines have come into conflict with the powers-that-be in Chianti Classico. While Silvio's methods in the vineyard and cellar yield what many consider

pure, classically expressive wines; the way he gets there, and occasionally the results (higher acidity, lighter colour or darker colour, etc.) means that he can only bottle one Chianti Classico and the rest are labelled as IGT Toscana. His wines exhibit incredible freshness, with the ageing done in very old barrels or concrete tanks and clay amphora for his flagship wines.

The breathtakingly beautiful Tenuta Di Valgiano is located in the North of Tuscany, 300 meters above sea level in the Colline Lucchesi appellation overlooking the city of Lucca. It has been a wine estate since the 16th century, and some of the buildings are almost as old as the estate. The farm covers 40 hectares, 16 of which are vineyards, and another 13 are home to honeybees and olive trees, which produce outstanding olive oil and honey. The Palistorti rosso and the Tenuta Di Valgiano

are made of a blend of Sangiovese, Merlot, Syrah, Ciliegiolo and Canaiolo. A bit more Merlot goes into the blend in cooler vintages, and in warmer vintages, a bit more Syrah is added. Both wines are made in the same way and aged between 12 to 15 months—the main difference between the two lies in the vine age. The vines used for Palistorti are 15 to 20 years of age, whereas the ones for Tenuta are around 35 to 40 years old.

Founded in 1999 by the twin sisters Margherita and Francesca Padovani, Fonterenza is a 4 hectare estate in the Southern part of Montalcino, Tuscany. Founded in 1899, the art of wine in the Pepe family has been handed down from father to son for 4 generations. Located 15 kilometres north Barcelona, with just 220 hectares Alella is one of the Spains smallest and oldest DO's. Sicus is located in Bonastre, in Tarragona and led by a remarkably single-minded young wine craftsman called Eduard Pié Palomar. A stone's throw away from the Atlantic ocean located in Val do Salnés in the north of Rías Baixas, this bodega is owned by the Méndez family. The soil in his vineyards is granitic sand, covered with a layer of humus, over granite bedrock. It is very poor, fast draining soil that vines struggle in and phylloxera cannot live in, hence many of the vineyards are deceptively old, up to

200 years! Even his Albariño comes from vines with an average age of 40 years. The recovery of century-old vineyards of indigenous red varieties, such as Caiño, Espadeiro and Loureiro, in addition to the white Albariño from old vineyards, are the base of their wines and a clear reflection of the terroir: wines full of freshness, with a perfect minerality and ample sensations.

In 1985, Thomas Ligas began to study the local ecosystems, experimenting with viticulture and vinification, and seeking to accentuate the distinctive qualities of his terroir. Thomas and Meli, father and daughter, work side by side to safeguard the health and maturity of their grapes, seeking an ideal balance between quality and quantity. This natural approach to viticulture preserves the original characteristics of the grape, as determined by the vineyard. They

only grow indigenous Greek varieties, some from the south like Assyrtiko, others nearly forgotten, like Kydonitsa and Limniona. The first performance of the Euripides tragedy Bacchae took place in the Theatre of Dionysus, in Pella, in around 408BC. Bacchus (or Dionysus) was the ancient god of wine and joy, and so it's fitting that Ktima Ligas is using the ancient techniques of this wine-producing region to bring both wine and joy to its customers today.

Domaine de Beudon is a remarkable place - a tiny farm perched on the steep side of the Swiss Alps above the village of Fully, and locally known as the "vineyard in the sky". Domaine de Beudon is the only wine grower there. Produced in tiny quantities, from just a 6-hectare estate, Beudon wine very rarely makes it out of Switzerland and onto the international market.
